The following actions have been completed :-

The lengthsmen's hours have been increased

The brook has been cleared in Hollow Lane

Planters, beds and hanging baskets have been installed for this current year

A community group to work at the Horticultural Centre has been formed - more volunteers would be welcome

A pharmacy has opened at Winshill Health Centre

The Winshill Directory has been produced (we apologise for the omission of St Mark's Scout Group)

A Citizens Panel has formed and is responding to consultations

Grant aid has been given to organisations throughout Winshill

We actively promote and advertise existing services through the Parish Newsletter

We regularly monitor and comment on planning applications in Winshill

The following are in the pipeline: -

Corresponding with identified partners about ways of progressing actions in the Parish Plan

An internet café is to open at the Youth club in September

We have commenced links with the Youth Club; Parish Councillors are to meet with Youth Forum

Bulky Waste collection is to be organised by ESBC

More bins, poop scoops and bags are to be provided by ESBC

Wardens will target areas where dog fouling is a problem and will issue fixed penalty notices

Drainage problems around Winshill Rec play area to be investigated/solved by ESBC

Training for lengthsmen to be provided by ESBC

Floodlighting for the teen shelter on Canterbury Rd recreation area is to be in place by October

Posts and baskets for outside shops on Bearwood Hill Road should be in place by the time you read this

Urban Parish Forums to be organised so that parish councils in Burton can share ideas

As I come to the end of my term of office it is a good time to look back on the achievements of Winshill Parish Council over the last six years and there are many including: -

Appointment of a lengthsman to keep Winshill clean and tidy, a move which increasingly is being copied by other parish councils.

Successful opposition to unacceptable planning applications including back garden developments and developments around Burton Flour Mill Coach House and the Water Tower.

Development of a Neighbourhood Resource Centre which houses Money Spider Credit Union, Umbrella Parent and Toddler Group and many other community services. Grant aid to local organisations such as churches, schools, St Mark's Scout Group, Ashby Road Tennis Club, Junior Schools' Soccer Teams and Winshill Soccer School

Regular Parish Newsletters

Contribution to a footpath on Winshill Recreation Ground

Representation at P.A.C.T. meetings.

Collection of evidence to present to the County Council which resulted in the preservation of the right of way on the footpath between Berry Gardens and Jacobean Court.

Enhancing the Parish by providing planters and flower beds at strategic points throughout the Parish
(see front page article)

Working with the Borough and County Council to tidy up and improve safety in Hollow Lane.

The formation of a community gardening group which works with the Horticultural Centre to grow plants for the aforementioned beds and planters.

The formation of a Citizens Panel with whom we can consult for ideas and opinions.


And finally, this year, the completion of our Parish Plan and the Winshill Directory, copies of both of which were delivered to schools, churches, sports clubs, societies, East Staffs Borough Council, Staffordshire County Council, other parish councils, other organisations in and around Winshill and to every household in Winshill.

The main feature of our existence has, I believe, been our willingness to work with the Borough and County Councils and other organisations for the benefit of Winshill as can be demonstrated by the list of partners in our Parish Plan. I believe that the Parish Plan points the way forward for us. We already have a Parish Plan Sub Committee of the Parish Council whose job is to monitor the plan and drive it forwards. What we must not do now is sit back and reflect on a "job well done".

Producing the plan was an opportunity for us to listen to the hopes and aspirations of the community and to make use of their ideas in order to build a better Winshill. We now have two tasks ahead of us.

The first is to make sure that the ideas already expressed in the Parish Plan come to fruition so that the people of Winshill will think it was a worthwhile exercise producing the plan. The second is to continue to consult with and listen to our parishioners and to keep adding to and changing or adapting the plan.

Finally, as I come to the end of my term of office, I would like to thank my fellow councillors for their hard work which has enabled us to come this far. Parish Council meetings are rarely dull and are often stimulating with frequent lively debate. Long may they continue to be so.
