132/22 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Councillors D Fletcher and Smith declared an interest regarding the NRC Charity.

133/22 **MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 17th July 2022 were agreed and signed as a correct record of events.

134/22 **CORRESPONDENCE**

A letter had been received from the Borough Council regarding the potential placement of dog bag dispensers. It was suggested that these could be sited at Newton Road Park, the Peace Wood, Canterbury Road Park, Winshill Recreation Ground and Tower Road Footpath.

The gullies along Bearwood Hill Road and Church Hill Street were programmed to be emptied soon.

139/22 **TOWN CENTRE REGENERATION FUND.**

It was reported that the bid for improvements to the town centre is likely to be incorporated into the levelling up bid worth in the region of £22.5 million in total.

140/22 **NEIGHBOURHOOD RESOURCE CENTRE**

The Centre Manager's report is attached.

Members considered the extent to which it could fund the various activities proposed at the Parish Fayre on Sunday 21st August. The Clerk advised that a road closure had been approved for Canterbury Road.

Resolved:

That a sum of £2,000 be agreed to support various activities at the Parish Fayre.

They were taken by minibus at 1.30pm and arrived back at 6.30pm, they were given some goody bags too and they all thoroughly enjoyed the day.

Lunch Club: Snack Attack Holiday club

Lunch Club has now finished for the Summer, and we are doing the Snack Attack holiday activities, which so far have been very well attended and there will be a report at the end of the 6 weeks holiday.

Coffee Morning: Breakfast Club

The breakfast club is also going well, there is a wide range of age groups attending and we had the older teenagers attend our continental breakfast.

Farm Fresh Revolution:

We had 90 packs of chicken, sausages and eggs donated from Pakington farm the sausages and chicken have been frozen so we can still provide meat and eggs during the 6 weeks holidays, along with fresh fruit and veg, which we have been able to source from JM Fruits from Burton Market with a funding from a neighbourly grant from Lidl, with tinned foods donated by Michael & Claire who donate to the centre weekly, this was distributed to 40 families. We will do this again in another couple of weeks.
